A quiet and shy boy, the young Isom was a reader, and it would be the written word he would turn to as he tried to make sense of his world. Many of Isom s stories are tied to the Southern Way of Life, a culture in which he grew up that assumed an inflexible white superiority represented by Jim Crow laws, laws that his father, a Greyhound Bus driver, was obligated to enforce in the face of a rising reaction by his African American riders that he neither understood nor tolerated. Isom s early adolescent views, shaped by his father s frustrations, are thrown into stark contrast as he is drawn to the positive influence of Helen and...
